 I'd better tie up my hair otherwise it will be too knotty.
 My family is with me otherwise I couldn't come to the beach.
 I chose these shorts otherwise I only had long pants to wear.
 All children must learn to swim otherwise they're not safe near water.
 Schools help children learn to swim, otherwise children are not water-safe.
 The balloon is a bright colour otherwise it would be harder to see.
 There is no box to stand on otherwise I'm sure I could get the balloon.
 These people must pick up their dog's poop otherwise the beach will be disgusting.

Conjunction of the Fortnight - instead

We use joining words when we want to link two ideas together.
 It helps our sentences sound better. They are not so short and choppy.

We use **instead** when we make a choice. It shows that an alternative, or a replacement, was chosen.

I played video games **instead** of chess.

I had pizza for dinner **instead** of pasta.

Otherwise

Go slowly otherwise the prints will smudge.
 Be careful otherwise you'll make a big mess.
 Let the colours dry otherwise the colours will mix.
 Don't clap otherwise paint will splash everywhere.
 Don't fold the paper with wet paint otherwise it will stick.
 Listen to the teacher otherwise you won't know what to do.
 Don't pick your nose otherwise you'll have paint on your face!
 Put the paint on thickly otherwise you won't get squelch lines.
 Wash your hands at the end otherwise paint will get on everything you touch.
 Turn the tap on slowly otherwise water will splash the paint everywhere.
